- Earn normal HS

Eligibility & Application Process

Elgibility Criteria...

★ Must Be On Track For HS Graduation

AND MEET 1 OF THE FOLLOWING:

GPA - 3.5 or Higher

OR

PSAT 9: EBRW - 410; MATH - 450 (No Minimum GPA)

OR

PSAT 10: EBRW - 430; MATH - 480 (No Minimum GPA)

Application Timeline

- Eligible Students are identified and notified in early April
- Application is due in early May 1
- Students qualifying using PSAT 10 will be notified over the summer

Typical Course Sequence

11th Grade:

- Semester One: COLL 101 & 5 HS classes
- Semester Two: 2 HFC classes & 4 HS classes

12th Grade:

- 1 HS elective class both semesters
- Full-time HFC schedule both semesters (3-4 courses; 10-15 credits)
- Treat this year like freshman year of college!!

13th Year:

- Full-time college schedule at HFC all year
- Must take senior math class for HS graduation

Counseling Support

- Dearborn Schools Counselor at HFC provides support throughout the program: college/career counseling, planning, scheduling, transfer plans, MTA, graduation, college applications, scholarships, etc.
- Access to HFC advisors and counselors for additional support
- Support in your college classes with tutoring and mentoring when needed. (Students must advocate for themselves)

Added Bonus!

WHAT COMES NEXT?

- Students apply to 4-year colleges as first-year freshman - they are eligible for all freshman, merit-based scholarships.
- Credits transfer from HFC and students will most likely begin as juniors in college, with only 2 years remaining for a bachelor's degree.

Take Note...

- Transportation is not provided
- Some costs not covered: cooking knife set, nursing scrubs or stethoscope, art kit, etc.
- Must maintain attendance and be on track for graduation at home high school
- Program benefits are not guaranteed they must be earned
- Challenging & Unique Program Not a good fit for all students.

On The Fence?

- It is easier to drop out of the program than to add to it late
- Students can opt out of the program and graduate with their normal class for various reasons
- Entering the program after the fall of 11th grade is not possible.
- So if you are on the fence about joining or not, better to join the program and possibly drop later.
